Friess encourages graduates to develop spiritual side

Foster Friess shared some personal insights during his address to over 300 graduates during Goldey-Beacom's 117th year commencement ceremonies on April 23, 2004. Friess is the Chairman of Friess Associates, whose internationally known Brandywine Fund is consistently rated one of the best mutual funds. His company now manages more than \$7 billion in assets under his leadership.

During his speech, Mr. Friess challenged the graduates to discover a more spiritual side to their working lives. He broke down spiritual issues into four categories: Fear, Guilt, Love, and Significance.

He urged the audience to learn how these issues affect their decision-making process in order to avoid those pitfalls made by business people whose names and companies are in the today's headlines. Qualities such as courage, loyalty, forgiveness, and patience are not always associated with a successful business person but Friess encouraged the graduates to develop those

characteristics.

Later in the ceremony, Bernadette and Robert Buccini and Fred C. Sears, II received honorary Doctor of Business Administration degrees. The Buccinis were recognized for their entrepreneurial spirit that propelled the small Edward J. DeSeta Company into one of the largest heating, ventilation, and air conditioning firms in the Middle Atlantic. They exemplify the self-made men and women whose efforts and profound work ethic guarantee success.

Noted community leader Fred Sears II is the President and CEO of the respected Delaware Community Foundation, one of the most prominent philanthropic organizations in the State. He is described by one community leader as "the quintessential business man who serves the community equally well."

The Excellence in Teaching Award was presented to Dr. Patricia Buhler.
